



The Albert Hall Museum in Jalpur is a 19th-century Indo-Saracenic architectural marvel showcasing 16 galleries that include folk art, lover, Indian culture and even a 322 B.C. Egyptian mummy. Jalpur is a veritable nirvana for all manner of tribal and fine jewelry, block-print textiles, pashminas and leather goods. Jalpur, like many Indian cities, is one of contrasts. Within moments, one can see aleborately decorated horses — often en route to wibrant Indian weddings — along with working camels next to late-model cars and scurrying pedestrians.

Traveling in India is not for the faint of heart, but it is also a uniquely marvelous, extraordinary experience.
